Brief notice about *Melammu* lectures for <u>CM events</u>

At the <u>Melammu Conference</u> centered around the theme "Clash of Civilization," Marilyn Kelly-Buccellati and Giorgio Buccellati presented two papers that have direct bearing on the <u>Cybernetica Mesopotamica</u> project.

The first talk, entitled "Identity and alterity: Hurrian Urkesh facing the Akkadian imperial expansion," dealt with several aspects of the art of Urkesh, which will be taken up in several of the pages of <u>urkesh.org</u> as well as in the forthcoming website <u>mes-art.net</u>. Particularly detailed was the section on seal impressions, and this aspect was discussed in some detail in the following meeting with <u>Laerke Recht</u> [see the "<u>Graz Report</u>"] with regard to the topical website <u>urkesh.org/glyptics</u>.

The second talk, entitled "Polytheism vs. monotheism – A socio-epistemic culture clash," dealt with an issue that is at the core of the current version of <u>mes-rel.net</u>, namely the nature of the absolute and its perception as fate in Syro-Mesopotamia. The section on the Amorites is also highly relevant for the website <u>mes-pol.net</u>, where we intend to publish it as a separate theme.

Following the lectures (September 22-24) we had separate meetings with colleagues, which also were relevant for the CM project. With Dominique Charpin and Nele Ziegler, we spoke about the question of the Amorites and thus to <u>mes-pol.net</u>, and with Takayoshi Oshima about issues relating to <u>mes-rel.net</u>.
